The First House in Petaluma

(Reprinted from an old newspaper clipping –
date/author unknown)

On a lot now owned by Dan Brown (now the Hotel Petaluma), in the rear of the old Brooklyn Hotel, stands a house which is the venerable pioneer building of this city.

It is made all the more interesting because another could hardly be built like it in all respects now.

The house was first erected in Maine, and every piece fitted and numbered. It was then placed on a vessel which was build by a company, each person working on it or contributing toward its construction, and so became part owner. It was called the "Packet," and arrived in San Francisco in 1850. The pioneer house was first put up by the owner Mr. Douglass, in Antioch, at the mouth of the San Joaquin River. Mr. Douglass did not like the location and finally made the acquaintance of one of our oldest citizens, now living here who gives this information, who advised removal to Petaluma.

A few months after, the citizens here were surprised to find a barge coming up the river. Mr. Douglass, his wife, two daughters, two sons and the house were on board, thirty five years ago. The house was carefully removed and erected on the lot above mentioned, where it is still in a fair state of preservation. Every piece except the shingles was numbered, and all were pine. The idea of a pine shingle shipped from Maine will cause a smile, but such it was then and is now.

It fronted on what was afterwards Washington Street. One can easily imagine the pride of Mr. Douglass and his family as they look on the graceful arches of the porch. And what was then no poor piece of work, over which many prayers and anxious thought and maybe tears had been given. The former owner moved to Oregon some few years ago, and has passed away.

The walls of this first house echoes other sounds and other feet press the ground, or trip along the floors.

So mote [might?] it be.

Note: The beautiful new Hotel Petaluma, now stands on this lot. Mr. Douglass was the grandfather of Mrs. E. W. M. Evans on her mother's side. Martha Street was named after her mother Martha Douglass. Mary Street was named after her aunt Mary. Mrs. Evans still has the local newspaper clipping from which the above is copied.

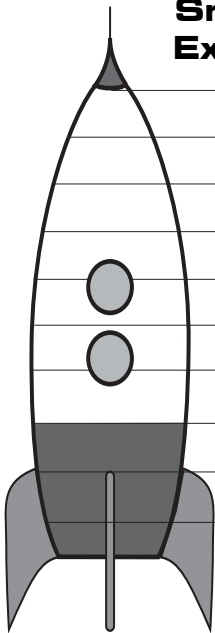
