

Carnegie Hall Style Concert in Carnegie Library



Petaluma, CA World famous pianist Jura Margulis gives a Carnegie Hall worthy benefit concert on May 19 at 7 p.m. at the Petaluma Museum, in the century old Carnegie Library at 20 Fourth St. in historic downtown.

Tickets are on sale now for the rare northern California appearance that represents something of a dream match of artist and venue. Tickets cost \$15 for Petaluma Museum members and \$20 for nonmembers. Proceeds from the concert, sponsored by Sky Hill Institute, benefit the Petaluma Museum and thereby its historic location locally noted for fabulous acoustics.

Russian-born Margulis has been recognized for his compellingly communicative performances, his tonal range and his virtuosity. He will be performing selections by Robert Schumann and Frederic Chopin.

Margulis has performed with the Russian National Orchestra at the Hollywood Bowl, The Montreal Symphony Orchestra under Charles Dutoit, the National Orchestra of Venezuela, the Thailand Philharmonic Orchestra and the Prague Symphony Orchestra. He is the executive director of the "International Piano Academy Freiburg," and artistic director of the Fulbright Concert Competition, an international piano contest. He holds the Emily J. McAllister Endowed Professorship in Piano at the J.W. Fulbright College of the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville.
